#### Why do we recognize National Substance Abuse Prevention Month?

Every day, many Americans are hurt by alcohol and drug use. From diminished achievement in our schools to greater risks on our roads and in our communities, to the heartache of lives cut tragically short, the consequences of substance use are profound. Yet, we also know that they are preventable.

Preventing drug use before it begins—particularly among young people—is the most cost-effective way to reduce drug use and its consequences. The best approach to reducing the tremendous toll substance use exacts on individuals, families, and communities is to prevent the damage before it occurs.

The President's *National Drug Control Strategy* promotes the expansion of national and community-based programs that reach young people in schools, on college campuses, and in the workplace with tailored information to help them make healthy decisions about their future. In fact, research has shown that every dollar invested in a proven school-based prevention program can reduce social costs, including those related to substance use, by an average of \$18.1

This month, we pay tribute to those working to prevent substance use in our communities and rededicate ourselves to building a safer, drug-free America.
